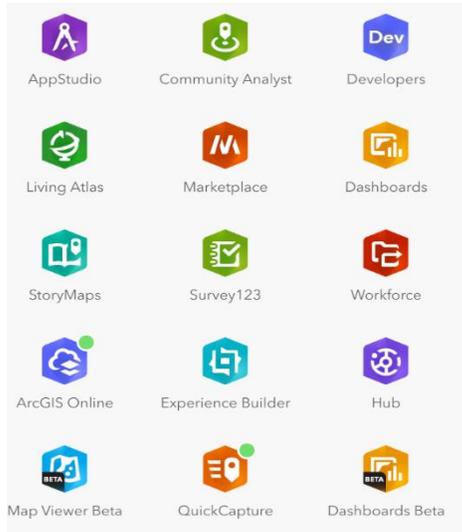


## GIS Update

**NC's Arc Users Conference--** is going virtual.

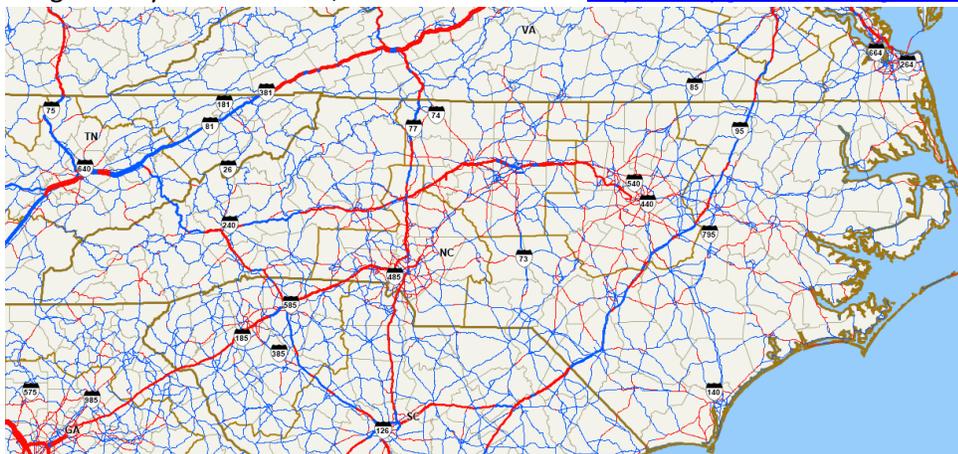
The conference is from September 2-4 with a theme of:

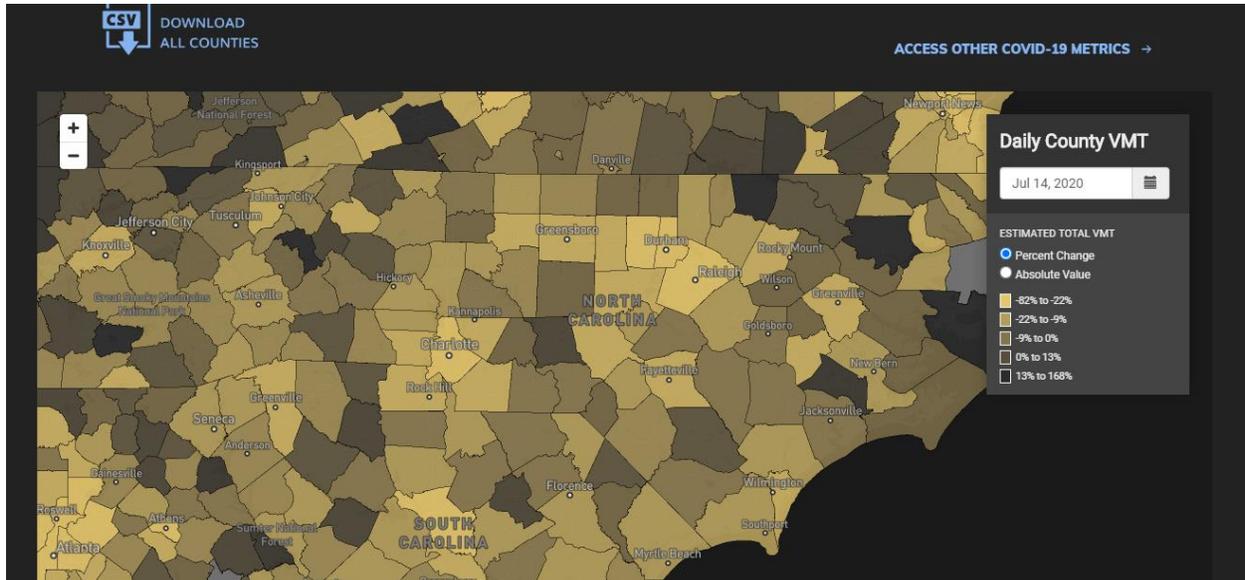
2045 Traffic Volumes Exceeding Capacity

Useful data for the manual POIs for SPOT Bike/Ped Projects:

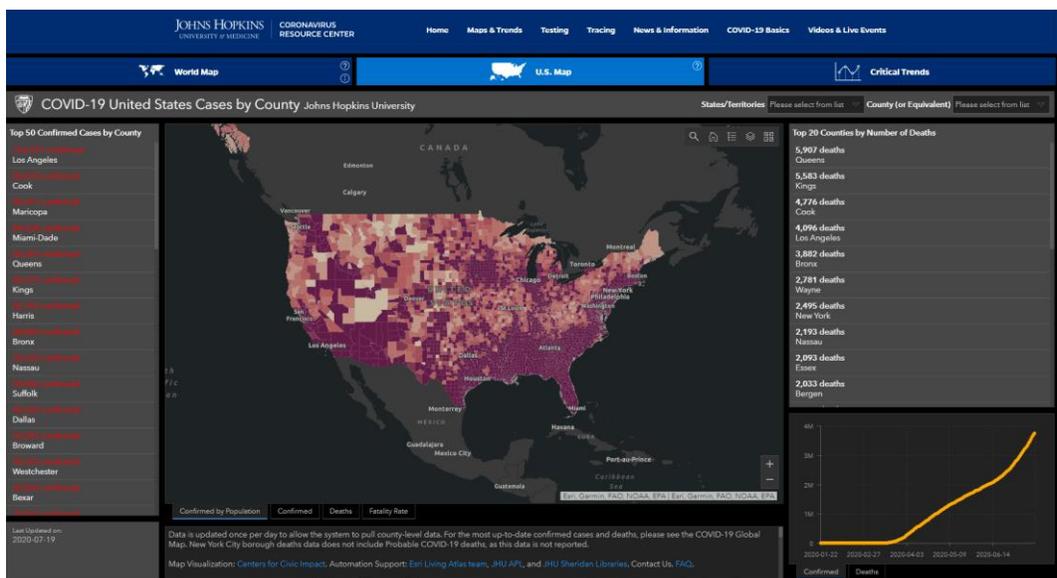
In the TPD geodatabases that we all should have received is the 2017 InfoUSA data. It is under Administrative and called InfoGroup Verified. You can limit the data to only include businesses over 10 or 25 people by doing a definition query using the attribute field, Actual\_Loc (is a TEXT FIELD!). You can add a numeric field to the table and calculate it to be ACTUAL\_LOC and then do the definition query. Or you can symbolize on the LOCATION\_1, which is grouped into 1-4, 5-9, 10-19 and on using Unique Values.
